# Race on to end count

### All declarations must be done by Monday - Bengo

THE Electoral Commission is in a race against time to declare all new parliamentarians by Monday. A total of 10 MPs have already

been declared since last Saturday but that only represents nine per cent of Parliament's 109 seats.

The long weekend gives polling teams an opportunity to complete counting and make declarations.

But Registrar of Political Parties Paul Bengo told Governmentowned Karai Radio yesterday he was not sure they could complete the job on time.

Prime Minister Sir Michael Somare has warned Mr Trawen that the election dates were fixed and the Electoral Commission should work within the given time


